## PARK INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

### **Proof of Insurance:**

Renters of a City Park providing public events shall furnish proof of insurance to the City of Roslyn in addition to any other requirement set out in RCW 12.180.030.

The renter shall provide a certificate of insurance evidencing the required insurance before being issued a permit or using the park.

The policy shall name the City of Roslyn as additional insured and the limits of renter's general liability insurance coverage shall be not less than:

- one million (\$1,000,000.00) for each incident of personal injury or death
- one million (\$1,000,000) aggregate coverage for any single accident or occurrence
- and fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) property damage coverage.

The insurance policy shall contain, or be endorsed to contain that the renter's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance and shall be placed with insurers with a current A.M. Best rating of not less than A:VII. (Ord. 814, 1996)

## SPECIAL EVENT INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

### **Liability Coverage Required.**

The applicant/sponsor of an event must possess or obtain public liability insurance to protect against loss from liability imposed by law for damages on account of bodily injury and property damage arising from the event. A certificate of insurance shall be filed thirty days prior to the event with the City Clerk, and shall name the city, its officials, employees and agents, as additional named insured. A specimen copy of the policy shall be filed ten days prior to the event. Insurance coverage must be maintained for the duration of the event.

**Minimum Limits Defined.** Coverage shall be a comprehensive general liability insurance policy. Minimum limits required are one million dollars each occurrence combined single limit bodily injury and property damage.

If food or non-alcoholic beverages are sold or served at the event, the policy must also include an endorsement of host liquor liability. The City Clerk may require additional endorsements depending upon the proposed activity.
