

ORDINANCE NO 1086

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ROSLYN, WASHINGTON, AMENDING RMC 2.10 CITY CLERK AND RMC 2.35 OFFICER BONDS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the City of Roslyn desires to update its municipal code when needed; and

WHEREAS, Roslyn Municipal Code section 2.10.020 states that the clerk shall perform the duties of the water commissioner; and

WHEREAS, the City of Roslyn no longer has a water commissioner; and

WHEREAS, Roslyn Municipal Code section 2.35 states that the clerk, treasurer, chief of police, police officer, police justice, and the city attorney require bonds; and

WHEREAS, the City of Roslyn no longer has its own police department or attorney and both are contracted for; and

WHEREAS, RCW 35A.12.080 requires the clerk and treasurer of a city to furnish a bond and the premiums to be paid by the City;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROSLYN, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. RMC Chapter 2.10.020 rescinded. Roslyn Municipal Code Chapter 2.10.020 is hereby rescinded.

~~2.10.020 Additional duties.~~

~~The duties of the water commissioner shall be performed by the city clerk. [Ord. 743 § 2, 1993; Ord. 244 § 1, 1917; Ord. 154 § 1, 1906.]~~

Section 2. RMC 2.35 Amended. Roslyn Municipal Code Chapter 2.35 (Officer Bonds) is hereby amended as follows:

2.35.010 Bonds required.

The officers of the city of Roslyn shall, before entering upon the duties of their respective offices, furnish proper surety bonds to the city of Roslyn in the amounts and in the manner, respectively, hereinafter set forth:

A. City clerk ~~and water commissioner~~, \$5,000;

B. City treasurer, \$25,000;

C. ~~Chief of police, \$2,000;~~ Deputy Clerk, \$5,000

D. ~~Police officer, \$1,000;~~ Deputy Treasurer, \$25,000

E. ~~Police justice, \$500.00;~~

F. ~~City attorney, \$500.00. [Ord. 290 § 1, 1924; Ord. 224 § 3, 1915; Ord. 154 § 3, 1906; Ord. 114 §§ 1, 2, 1901; Ord. 15 § 1, 1890.]~~

2.35.020 Premiums.

The premiums on said bonds shall be paid by the city of Roslyn. [Ord. 290 § 2, 1924.]

Section 3. Severability. Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance, or its application to any person or circumstance, be declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid for any reason, or should any portion of this Ordinance be pre-empted by state or federal law or regulation, such decision or pre-emption shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance or its application to other persons or circumstances.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be published in the official newspaper of the City, and shall take effect and be in full force five (5) days after the date of publication.
